1. INTRODUCTION

This is the tenth Management Plan (MP) prepared for Tree Farm Licence (TFL) 33, and it must meet the requirements of the *Tree Farm Licence Management Plan Regulation* (B.C. Reg. 280/2009). This regulation, enacted by the provincial government in November 2009 (with associated amendments) to the *Forest Act*), includes content requirements, submission timing and public review requirements for TFL Management Plans.

This document provides a general description and history of the TFL, lists the primary planning documents that guide the management of the TFL and summarizes outcomes from the public review and First Nations referral process. The draft MP also includes, as appendices, the accepted Information Package and a draft timber supply analysis.

1.1 Location and Description of TFL 33


TFL 33, which is managed by Canoe Forest Products Ltd. (CFP), is situated within the Columbia Wet Belt on the Western slopes of the Shuswap Mountain Range. It lies immediately to the North of Sicamous adjacent to Shuswap Lake and comprises a total land base of 8,396 hectares. Elevation of the licence area is from approximately 347 meters at lake level to approximately 1700 meters on Queest Mountain.

TFL 33 lies within two BioGeoClimatic zones - the Interior Cedar Hemlock (ICH) and the Engelmann Spruce-Subalpine Fir (ESSF). There are six biogeoclimatic subzones in the TFL, including ICHmw2, ICHwk1, ICHdw4, ESSFwc2, ESSFwcp, and ESSFwcw.

Access through TFL 33 is important for both summer and winter sports (mountain biking, hiking, ATV'ing, and snowmobiling. Hunters also utilize the access through the TFL in the fall. Access along the foreshore of Shuswap Lake adjacent to the TFL is by boat only, and houseboats use the Provincial Park system for moorage during the summer. Visual quality of TFL 33 as seen from Shuswap Lake is an important management consideration.

2. HISTORY

TFL 33 was first awarded to Shuswap Timbers of Sicamous in 1959, with the initial cutting permit issued on March 1, 1960. As no roaded access was available to the licence at that time, all the volume was watered on the foreshore and boomed to the conversion plant. Development was concentrated on the lower slopes within proximity of Shuswap Lake.

In 1965, Shuswap Timbers was purchased by Federated Co-operatives Ltd. and the official transfer of quota followed in 1970. As a result of the amalgamation, milling facilities were closed in Sicamous and all volume was subsequently directed to Canoe.

All-weather roaded access to the license was completed in 1973 and harvesting was concentrated at the higher elevations of the license. Tree planting was first carried out in 1972 when approximately 34.4 hectares were planted – up to that time natural regeneration was the predominant reforestation method. Canoe Forest Products Ltd. purchased the rights to TFL 33 in 2012.

2.1 Allowable Annual Cut History

A summary of the AAC's for TFL 33 is provided in Table 1. In 1989, The Small Business Forest Enterprise Program (SBFEP) was allocated 1,450 m3 AAC. The SBFEP is now known as the British Columbia Timber Sales (BCTS).

3. PUBLICLY AVAILABLE PLANNING DOCUMENTS

3.1 Regional and Landscape Level Plans

The Okanagan-Shuswap Land and Resources Management Plan (OSLRMP) covers approximately 2.5 million hectares. The planning process was initiated in July 1995 and completed in September 2000. The plan was approved by government in January 2001. The plan was developed by over 30 public and government participants representing a wide range of values such as water, timber, wildlife, fisheries, mining, recreation, tourism, conservation and agriculture.

The OSLRMP provides direction for the management of the Crown land and resources within the plan area. Through their recommendations package the participants clearly articulated their vision for a balance land use strategy. The plan includes management direction that applies across the entire plan area (i.e., general management), resource management zones (RMZs) where integrated resource management is practiced based on objectives and strategies specific to that RMZ.

3.2 Government Action Regulations

Government Action Regulations (GAR) orders in effect for areas of TFL 33 include:

• Ungulate Winter Range Mountain Caribou Revelstoke Shuswap and South Monashee Planning Units #U-3-005, #U-8-004; and Mule Deer U-8-001 Okanagan TSA.

3.3 Operational Plans

TFL 33 is included in The Gorman Group of Companies Forest Stewardship Plan FSP ID #696 – approved September 28, 2018 for a period of five-years. The plan states results, strategies or measures that the licensee will achieve or employ in order to be consistent with government objectives that apply to the area covered by the FSP.

3.4 Independent Forestry Certification Programs

Operations on TFL 33, through the Gorman Group of Companies, are certified under the Sustainable Forestry Initiative® (SFI®) 2015-2019 Forest Management Standard.

SFI Program Participants make a commitment to sustainable forest management that encompasses a variety of responsibilities including maintaining forest productivity and health and protecting water quality, biological diversity and special sites. This commitment also involves providing employee, contractor and harvesting professionals with training and education, supporting research, and broadening the practice of sustainable forestry through landowner outreach and community involvement.



4. TIMBER SUPPLY ANALYSIS

The TFL MP Regulation requires a management plan to contain a timber supply analysis that analyzes the short and long-term availability of timber for harvesting in the TFL including the impact of management practices on the availability of timber. The Regulation also requires supporting documentation for the timber supply analysis including resource inventories, a description of the model and analytical methods used to formulate the timber supply and any other information relevant to timber supply on the TFL.

4.1 Supporting Documentation for Timber Supply Analysis

An Information Package was prepared prior to timber supply modelling, and describes the resource inventories, management practices and model description to be used in the analysis (see Appendix 2). The Information Package was made available for First Nations referral and public review, and was later accepted by the Ministry of Forests, Lands, Natural Resource Operations and Rural Development Forest Analysis and Inventory Branch on July 20, 2020.

The latest timber supply analysis for TFL 8 (see Appendix 3) was prepared by Forsite Consultants Ltd. using the PATCHWORKS ™ modeling software.

5. PUBLIC REVIEW STRATEGY

As per Section 6 of the *TFL Management Plan Regulation* a proposed *Public Review Strategy* was submitted to the BC Ministry of Forests, Lands, Natural Resource Operations and Rural Development (FLNRO) on October 10th, 2019 and was subsequently approved by the Regional Executive Director on November 4th, 2019 (see Appendix 1).

The approved *Public Review Strategy* indicates the timelines for review for both the draft Timber Analysis Information Package and the Management Plan for TFL 33. Also included is the Agency, First Nations and Stakeholders that will be contacted during the review process. Copies of the advertisements that will be placed in local papers allowing the general public to comment are also included in the strategy. As per the *Public Review Strategy*, comments and any considerations will be incorporated into the Final Management Plan for submission to the Chief Forester.

6. REVIEW OF DRAFT MANAGEMENT PLAN

As per the approved *Public Review Strategy*, notifications were sent in mid-September 2020. Advertisements were placed in local papers and appeared in the September editions.

Ministry of Forests, Lands, Natural Resource Operations and Rural Development (FLNRORD) Forest Analysis and Inventory Branch (FAIB) received a draft copy of the Management Plan.

Referral and Public Review Strategy

Management Plan (MP) #10 for Tree Farm Licence (TFL) 33 is being prepared by Canoe Forest Products

As per the *TFL Management Plan Regulation*, Section 6, the requirements for public review and comment, requires that a strategy be submitted 1-year before the date the Management Plan is submitted to the Chief Forester. The new MP is planned to be submitted to the Ministry of Forests, Lands, Natural Resource Operations and Rural Development in September 2020 with a required approval date by March 31, 2021.

Planning and Proposed Timelines

A draft Timber Analysis Information Package (Info Pack) will be produced and available for review. Comments received and any adjustments to the package will be documented and a final Information Package will be submitted to Forest Analysis and Inventory Branch (FAIB) of the Ministry of Forests, Lands, Natural Resource Operations & Rural Development (FLNRORD) for acceptance. 





Property owners adjacent to TFL 33 in the Marble Point Area have expressed operational concerns over the years. In response, CFP has identified a 252 hectare polygon above Marble Point where harvest rates will be controlled. Harvest within this polygon will be constrained in the model by applying a rate-of-cut restriction that limits the amount of harvest to three hectares per year.
